## Items Needed for Veteran Stockings!

While digging around in my purse for a donation, I found that she was involved with the American Legion Auxiliary, and they fill and deliver Christmas stockings to Veteran's nursing homes around Georgia. While I was attaching the Poppy to my jacket, she confided that the Auxiliary was still short donations of items needed to fill 200 **more** stockings (they fill at least 1000 each year). Her stream of donations has been exhausted, and she just didn't know how the Auxiliary would meet their goal.

Please drop items off at my home any time (there will be a plastic container by the front door in which to place your items) by December 6. The recipients like to receive notes in their stockings, so if you wish to write a note to include with your donation, please do so.

### Guidelines:

1. All items must be unopened
2. No mouth wash please
3. Travel size items only.
4. Do not put the candy in the same bag as toiletries.
5. While all donations will be appreciated, it would be especially helpful if the toiletries items were in a SET (one of each item) in a zip lock bag.

Toiletry Items: (Wal-Mart and Target have a good selection of travel size)

- Body Soap
- Body Lotion
- Shampoo
- Shaving Cream
- Razor Blades
- Toothpaste
- Toothbrush
- Deodorant

### Miscellaneous Items:

- Sweat Pants – all sizes (needed for the Blind Unit)
- White handkerchiefs
- Individually wrapped candy bars, any size, no nuts
- Hair Scrunches
- Nail Polish
- Cream Rinse
